IMPLEMENTATION OF EXECUTIVE ORDER 003, 2017 ON SUPPORT FOR LOCAL CONTENT IN PUBLIC PROCUREMENTS BY MINISTRIES, DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES (MDAS) OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT OF NIGERIA

This Circular is to bring to attention for *immediate compliance*, further directives on the Executive Order No. 003 of 2017 (EO-003, 2017) on Support for Local Content in Public Procurements by MDAs issued by His Excellency, the Ag. President on 18th May, 2017.

- 2. The policy thrust of the EO-003, 2017 is to among others promote patronage of "Made-in-Nigeria" goods and services. It is also aimed at providing support for local content in public procurements with the goal of strengthening the Naira, creating jobs, grow entrepreneurial capability to engender competition among local manufacturers that will drive down costs and improve quality.
- 3. Towards the effective implementation of the Executive Order, MDAs are hereby required to comply with the following:
 - propose policies (of not more than two pages) that will ensure that the Federal Government's procurement of goods and services maximizes the use of goods manufactured in Nigeria and services provided by Nigerian citizens in business;
 - ii. **assess** the monitoring, enforcement, implementation and compliance with the EO-003, 2017 and local content stipulations in the Public Procurement Act or any other relevant Act within the MDAs; and
- determine through the Procurement Department, compliance with the 40% minimum threshold for local content of the respective MDAs expenditure particularly, the prioritized eight manufactured goods and services stipulated in paragraph 4 of the EO-003, 2017.

- 4. In furtherance of the above and to ensure uniformity, three reporting templates marked Annexures I-III are herewith attached for adoption by MDAs to guide the development of the policy inputs and render returns on compliance with local content stipulation to the Honourable Minister, Federal Ministry of Industry, Trade and Investment (FMITI).
- 5. MDAs are required to implement structures to actualize the objectives of the EO-003, 2017, accordingly, there shall established within the SERVICOM Units of MDAs a "Local Content Section" to be headed by an officer not below GL 13 assigned with responsibilities for continuous monitoring and evaluation of compliance with EO-003,2017 in the procurement activities of the respective MDAs. Accordingly, returns on the policy inputs and periodic returns on compliance with the local content stipulation should be submitted to the Honourable Minister, FMITI not later than Friday, 25th August, 2017, while evidence of compliance with the establishment of the Local Content Section shall be communicated to the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation.
- 6. Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Extra-Ministerial departments and Agencies are to note that compliance with the provisions of this Circular is mandatory and any action to the contrary will be visited with appropriate sanction.
